LMDA Conference 2008

The 2008 conference, in addition to tackling dramaturgical issues related to producing Shakespeare, dance, and theatre for young audiences, will consider the challenges presented by the highly charged national and international discussion of immigration and the border through the lens of this border city. Playwrights from Mexico City, Tijuana, and San Diego will join us to explore the impact of the border on their work.

Featured speakers include:

Naomi lizuka (playwright and Head of MFA Playwriting Program at UCSD) lizuka will be teaching a master class on playwriting aimed at writers and dramaturgs alike. Limited space is available for this special session.

Morgan Jenness (Abrams Artists Agency) An Obie-award winning dramaturg, champion of new plays, agent, and longtime member of LMDA, Jenness will moderate a session on partnerships between professional and university theatres.
