Mrs. Elizabeth Titcomb was very much interested in the Tacoma

Art League which met at the College of Puget Sound for many years. She
was also interested in the College and was on our Board of Trustees for
several years. While on the Board, she was chairman of the committee
to secure furnishings for some of the dormitories and particularly the
new student center.

I called on her about every three months to keep her interest and to bring her up to date on things at the College and one time I sensed that she was somewhat unhappy. I asked her if something had happened. She said she was asked to be a judge at the Song fest, which was an activity of the Greek organizations where each group sang a song and presented some kind of entertainment skit. She said she was shocked at one of the sororities that sang as an encore the selection from Oklahoma, "I'm Just a Girl Who Cain't Say 'No". It took some time for her to assuage her feelings on this incident which happened.

She did tell me that she had set up a trust of \$100,000 for the University in her estate. Mrs. Titcomb died recently and I believe the University will receive a bequest through her estate.
